The concrete content varies depending on the individual class, but includes work on: <ul> <li>Input: listening, reading and writing strategies, i.e. accessing and gathering relevant information from a variety of sources, critical evaluation of sources as well as interpreting and processing this information in an effective manner; preparation for professional contexts in academia and/or work life; establishing critical thinking as an essential part of professional contexts.</li> <li>Output: identifying the target audience, what they need, and how to most effectively convey one's 'message' by selecting the most appropriate means of communication; the most helpful structure and content; the most effective supporting material (including visual aids as appropriate); the most appropriate language and register; presenting and defending</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
